## LIVE STOCK RULES & REGULATIONS

### 1. Entries

A. Entries in the 4-H & FFA beef show will be accepted from all 4-H and FFA members. 4-H and FFA beef entries also eligible for the OPEN BEEF SHOW. Each Open Beef Show entry must pay a \$10.00 entry fee. 4-H & FFA must pay a \$5 entry fee.

B. All entries must be in place according to the general rules governing the Concordia Fall Festival. Entries in the beef classes close at 9 a.m. No livestock will be unloaded before 7 a.m. the day of the show and no pens will be reserved. Animals will be weighed as unloaded.

C. Beef breeding animals must have registration in the exhibitor's name and show a possession date on or before May 1, 2011.

### 2. Judging and Premium

#### A. Open show prize money will be paid as follows:

Overall Champion Bull \$125.00  
Overall Champion Female \$125.00  
Steer \$125.00  
Breed Champion \$25.00

#### B. If shown by breed prize money will be as follows:

First (Breed Champion) \$25.00  
Second \$15.00  
Third \$10.00  
Fourth \$5.00

#### C. If shown by class prize money will be as follows:

First \$10.00  
Second \$7.50  
Third \$5.00

#### D. 4-H and FFA show prize money will be paid as follows:

First place of class \$10.00  
Second place of class \$7.50  
Third place of class \$5.00

E. NO TROPHY OR OPEN SHOW PRIZE MONEY AWARDED UNLESS COMPETITION SHOWN IN THAT BREED.

3. Responsibility for loss of exhibits—Every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits but neither the Fall Festival Committee nor the Livestock Committee will be responsible for loss, damage or personal accident to exhibitors and exhibits, due to any cause.

4. Premium paid following show. In order to obtain premiums, however, all bedding straw, debris, etc. must be cleaned from exhibitor's stall or tie-outs and taken back home again. Stalls and tie-outs will be examined by the exhibitor and members of the respective committee before premium issued.

5. Livestock judges to be announced the day of the show.

6. A licensed veterinarian will be on hand to make inspection of other livestock at the fairgrounds the day of the show.

7. Anyone showing in the purebred category cannot show the same animal in the same class in the commercial category.

8. All steers must be purchased by March 1. The steer classes will be judged by weight instead of by breeds. There will be a limit of 15-20 steers in each class. Any final decision will be up to the beef show committee.

9. All bulls are to be shown with a nose lead.

10. Breeding classes with more than 7 head will be broken by age and will be paid according to the 2C above.

11. 4-H or FFA exhibitors must be enrolled in projects in which he/she is showing.

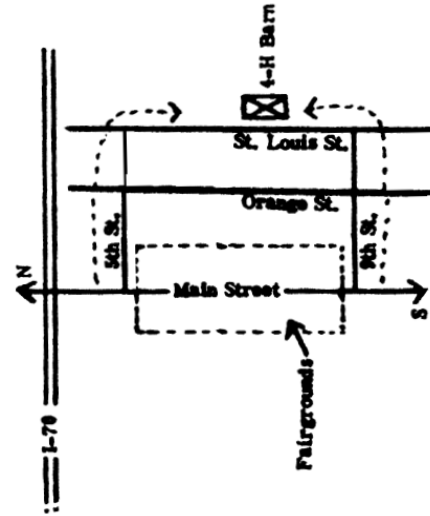
12. All livestock must be owned by the 4-H and FFA members. It should be shown by the member. An exception to this rule is hospitalization of the member, more than one entry in a class or participation in another 4-H and FFA event at the fair. In this case the animal can be shown by another 4-H or FFA member.

13. Only blue ribbon animals shall be considered for champion or grand champion ribbon and awards.

14. The livestock committee will have the authority and power to interpret all rules and regulations and to settle all matters and differences in regard to all rules and regulations.

15. All youth exhibitors are eligible to show in showmanship.

Location of 4-H Livestock Exhibition Bldg. is at 7th and St. Louis Street in Concordia, Mo. Watch for one-way streets around fairground area.



## MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE VETERINARY DIVISION ANIMAL HEALTH STANDARDS FOR EXHIBITION —2011

These are proposed animal health requirements for exhibition for 2011. They are subject to change until May 10, 2011.

1. Health Certificates. Valid for 30 days.

A. All animals for exhibition must be accompanied by an official health certificate and other documents as indicated. If an official veterinarian is present at the show to make health examinations, Missouri exhibitors may show steers, sheep and horses without a health certificate. Accredited and certified herd numbers, date of last test, dates of vaccination or treatment, name of products and amounts used and the veterinarian's name must be indicated on the health certificate. Animals showing clinical evidence of disease including warts and ringworm will not be permitted to show, and shall be subject to isolation, or expulsion, depending upon the nature and seriousness of the disease.

B. Scheduled breed association shows, county fairs or other shows, will employ veterinarians other than regulatory personnel for processing animals and health certificates for change of ownership.

C. For special permits call 573-751-4359.

D. Entry requirements for exhibition as listed, are minimum animal health standards, and do not qualify animals for sale, change of ownership or interstate movement.

### 2. Cattle

#### A. Brucellosis

1. All breeding cattle four (4) months of age and over, including all bred heifers, must be tested and negative within ninety (90) days prior to entry except:

A. Animals from a Brucellosis Certified Free Herd. Date of last herd test and herd number to be shown.

B. Non-pregnant OCV heifers of beef breeds under twenty (20) months of age.

C. Non-pregnant OCT heifers of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age.

D. Steers. No test required. Must be listed and identified on certificate.

2. In addition to the above requirements, due to high incidence of brucellosis, all breeding cattle eight (8) months of age and over from the following states shall enter only with a prior permit from the Missouri state veterinarian's office (telephone 573-751-4359):

A. Arkansas, Alabama, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee and Texas.

B. Permits will be granted to owners of Certified Brucellosis Free Herds, or to those herd owners who in the judgment of the state

veterinarian, have herds with a history of negative brucellosis status.

**B. Tuberculosis**

1. Intrastate. All Missouri breeding cattle, eight (8) months of age and over from non-quarantined herds to be tested and negative within ninety days prior to entry to be from a Tuberculosis-Free herd with date of test and herd number shown.

2. Interstate. All breeding animals eight (8) months of age and over from non-quarantined herds to be tested and negative within ninety (90) days prior to entry to be:

A. From a Tuberculosis Free Herd with a date of test and herd number shown.

B. Be direct from a herd within a TB Accredited free state.

C. Steers. No test required.

**C. Scabies**

1. Cattle originating in scabies quarantined areas or herds are eligible to show.
